Superintendent Dubois read the following report to update the board on DPW, Sewer, Water departments.

"We rented a milling attachment for the Bobcat and the crew milled bad areas of pavement on the streets and in the parking lots to repair before winter as well as to mill

the raveled edges of the upper end of School St. They used hot mix, state-top to fill the milled areas and replace the paved driveway approaches on School St.

The crew is performing a door-to-door inspection of water services as I reported last month. We are down to approximately 75 to go. Unfortunately, we are running out of time this fall to replace the sidewalk on South Main St in front of the UCC. It will be a priority next spring after pageant. Suite-Kote put a micro pave on Classic St and the entrance and parking lot to the Electric/DPW.

No update on the North Main drainage project other that Cushman is working on contacting one of the lien holders.

No update on the EPG grant.

No update on the signage project – I have not received the report yet from Delta Engineering."

Superintendent DuBois read the following report to update the board on the Electric Department.

"Work on pole replacements on North Main Street from School St southward continues. This will continue for a couple more weeks. These poles are difficult. The crew is doing its best make these poles as neat and tidy as possible.

NYSERDA Clean Energy Community grant – I'm waiting for the final contract – due this week.

Fiber

685 customers to date are taking SherburneConnect service. West Lake fiber installation will begin this week.

Phase II fiber project

I and the part-time manager for the project, Jim Emerson who was hired by the Towns, have spent a lot of time learning about and figuring out the best approach to the pole permitting and make ready work for this project. The Bill of Material for the fiber only, has been completed and a joint bid document has been drafted. A bid will be let out – probably in October for the fiber. The NY ConnectAll office wants us to secure the fiber as soon as possible. "

Mayor Acee said he had an amendment to the contract signed with Municipal Solutions dated March 24, 2023 for the Wastewater Treatment Project. Mayor Acee said he was seeking board approval to sign the amendment on behalf of the village.
